You are invited to the James W. Miller Learning Resources Center (the library) at St. Cloud State University to view the traveling exhibit *Elizabeth I: Ruler and Legend*.

The self-guided exhibit opens for public viewing Friday, Aug. 25. Its last day will be Saturday, Oct. 7. The Miller Center is located between Third Avenue and Fifth Avenue South and Sixth Street and Seventh Street South in St. Cloud, Minn.

The exhibit will be on display in the Miller Center 2nd Floor West reading court. From the building's main lobby, turn west into the library and take the atrium staircase

up to the reading court.

Parking is available in a pay lot near the north entry to the Miller Center. During the day, street parking is available west of Fifth Avenue South. After 5 p.m., the streets closest to the Miller Center are also available.

The exhibit

This traveling exhibit features photographic representations of the full Elizabeth I exhibit that Chicago's Newberry Library had on display in 2003. The self-guided exhibit raises questions of leadership and power during Elizabeth's 45-year reign.

- Newberry Library exhibit curator Dr. Clark Hulse presents a keynote address on the making of the exhibit.
- Costumes from Shakespeare plays presented by Minnesota's Guthrie Theater will be on display in the Atwood Center Gallery.
- Actor Robin Johnson will portray Elizabeth I.
- Share a day in the park with visiting actors

from Iowa who will recreate Elizabeth's royal court.

- Joseph Horse Capture, associate director at the Minneapolis Institute of Arts, discusses portrayals of native peoples of the Americas.
- Join a book-talk discussion of *The Leadership Secrets of Elizabeth I* – contact Angela Wortham, project director, to join the book talk.
